

# Beaufort Stops New Bern Once, Drops Close One

A heart-breaking ninth inning homer broke a tie in New Bern's favor Saturday at New Bern but Beaufort came back Sunday for a revenge, revenge that was sweet by virtue of a 21-6 victory over the New Bern team that won 7-6 Saturday.

New Bern took an early five-run lead Saturday but by the fifth inning Beaufort had evened up the score. New Bern went ahead in the seventh but Beaufort scored another tying run in the eighth. At the start of the last half of the ninth the score was still knotted at the six-all count.

Stilley, the first man at bat for the Falcons, teed off on the first pitch and socked a homer that measured 425 feet from the plate. New Bern won out, 7-6.

Oakley was winning pitcher for New Bern while Piner got credit for the loss. Stilley with two for five led New Bern's hitting. Sadler with three for five and Applegate with two for four topped Beaufort.
