

# Webb Gains Win, Allowing Six Hits, Striking Out Five

## Kelly Bangs in Seven Runs As Mates Pound Three Marshallberg Hurlers

Morehead City took some of the whiz out of Whiz Kid pitchers Saturday afternoon blasting hurlers Ben Oakley, Bill Wooten, and Joe Hines for 11 hits, while trouncing Marshallberg 20-4 at Wade Bros. park.

Four extra base hits coupled with 10 walks and seven infield errors did the damage as Manager Bill Tuttle's nine bunched five runs in the second, seven in the third — knocking out starter and loser Oakley; four in the fourth — sending Wooten back to leftfield, and two each in the sixth and eighth innings off Hines.

The hits Morehead got, they made count. Leading the hit and run parade were cleanup man Fenner Boyd, who banged a double and three singles in six times at bat to chase in three runs, and Maywood Kelly, who set an early season RBI record, driving in seven runs. The stocky right-handed slicker obuted a single and a three run home run off the centerfield gym in six trips to the plate.

Left-handed pull-hitter Tom Woody also poled a long round tripper, picking out a slow Wooten curve in the third, sending it on a line over the rightfield wall.

### Webb Wins

And while Morehead runners were busily scampering across home plate inning after inning, Jimmy Webb was silencing Whiz Kid bats with but six hits. Only in the sixth inning, when Marshallberg collected three runs of two hits, was the lithe southpaw in trouble. He walked only one while striking out five in going the distance.

Only 'Kid to solve the curveballer for two hits was first baseman Tuok Crocker, connecting for two two-baggers down the leftfield line — the last drive in the sixth scoring Hines who had singled, and Wooten, who was hit by a pitched ball. Wooten, running for Crocker, who injured his ankle early at first base, then stole home for the final tally.

From then on Whiz Kid slickers went down in order with the exception of Hines who reached first safely in the eighth when Bill Holt bobbled his hopper to third.

Twice Morehead batted around — in the second and third innings — when they combined a total of six walks with two infield errors and six hits to score 12 runs, icing the contest but good.

After Woody popped up to shortstop to start the second, Ray Robinson walked, went to second on Tuttle's rap into left, and scooted to third as Ernie Conner walked. Webb popped up to short, but Holt

sent the first two Morehead runs across with a smash that bounced off Cole's leg.

Oakley then walked Skinny Ellis and Holt stole second. The sacks were jammed. But they didn't remain that way for long as Kelly unloaded a liner to right, plating Conner and Holt. Oakley helped the final run of the inning across by bobbling Boyd's trickler halfway between third and the mound.

Morehead continued their run avalanche the following frame by tallying seven times before relief pitcher Wooten finally got Robinson — hitting his second time of the inning — on a fly to center to end the inning. Robinson led off with a single to right, Tuttle walked, Conner doubled in the sixth run. Holt walked and with the bases loaded and the count 2-0, Wooten came in and walked Ellis to drive in another run.

Kelly's grounder to short knocked in another tally, and Boyd drove in two more with a line drive to center. Woody kept the rally going by sailing a 3-2 pitch just inside the telephone pole and out of the ball park to wind up the hectic inning's scoring. Kelly's three-run blast in the following inning routed Wooten.

#### Diamond Sidelights

An unusual bit of lineup juggling was done by Marshallberg statagists enabling the top players to stay in the lineup for the complete game. Wooten started in leftfield, took over mound duties in the third when Oakley was knocked out, and returned to leftfield after himself being blown off the hill the following inning.

Tom Benton, former Wilson second-sacker, sat on the Morehead bench, but was ineligible for play, not possessing an official release from the pro team. However, the hard hitting lefthander will be ready for action very soon, and should lend considerable help to both Morehead hitting and fielding departments.
