

Beaufort Seadogs Manhandle Havelock Rams for Easy Win

Pamlico Whips Atlantic Girls

The Atlantic lassies faded in the second half as the Pamlico Central girls won a 62-35 decision at Atlantic Friday night. The first half ended with Pamlico ahead by only four points, 24-20. In the second half the winners out-scored Atlantic by a 38-15 margin.

Rita Gilgo scored 21 points for Atlantic. Gilgo of Pamlico led her team with 21 points, too. Janis Goodwin scored two points for Atlantic. Anita Brown scored eight and Linda Taylor hit for four.

Pamlico County forwards were Gilgo, Alexander, 13, Ross, 16, Freeman, 10, and Casey, 2.

Guards for Atlantic were Brenda Salter, Jean Fulcher and Jensey Mason. Playing guard for Pamlico were Paul, Barnes and Carawan.

The Beaufort Seadogs turned back the Havelock Rams 95-53 at Beaufort Friday night. Coach T. H. McQuaid used reserves liberally, but the second team continued to build the score while it was on the floor.

The Seadog starters, Pud Hassell, Alex Copeland, Raymond Gillikin, Butch Hassell and Danny Willis, ran up a 26-17 score in the first quarter.

In the second quarter Coach McQuaid put in Frank Potter for Copeland. He took out Butch Hassell late in the quarter in favor of Sammy Merrill. This combination ran the score to 51-30 by the end of the first half of play.

Second Half Begins

Bobby Willis, Calvin Jones, Allen Autry, Pud Hassell and Danny Willis started for the Seadogs in the second half. Kit Jones replaced Hassell midway through the third quarter. The score stood at 75-44 at the beginning of the fourth period.

Starting the final period were Merrill, Potter, Copeland, Gillikin and Butch Hassell. These five played most of the last quarter and were responsible for taking the score on up to 95 points.

Butch Hassell, who played less than three quarters, scored 36 points to lead scorers on both teams. Pud Hassell, playing his first game as a starter, came through in good style and hit for 16 points.

Two Have Colds

Hassell broke into the starting line-up when Coach McQuaid decided that Merrill would not be able to see much action due to a bad cold. Larry Dudley, another cold victim, did not even suit out for the game.

Danny Willis scored 11 points and Gillikin hit for 10 to put four of the five starters in the double-figure scoring column. Copeland scored five points.

Autry scored seven points, Potter and Bobby Willis scored three

each, and Merrill and Calvin Jones scored two each. Kit Jones failed to score.

Hit 54 Per Cent

The Seadogs took 81 shots from the floor and connected 44 times for 54 per cent accuracy. They hit on seven of 15 shots from the free throw line for 47 per cent accuracy.

Richard Lee was top scorer for the Rams with 20 points. Richard Lupton scored 14 and Richard Edwards hit for 10. Other players scoring for Havelock were Bob Denton, 4, Ray Frauenholz, 4, and Tommy Moore, 1.

The Rams took 35 shots from the floor and scored on 15 attempts for 43 per cent. They hit on 23 of 30 shots from the free throw line for 77 per cent accuracy.
