

# K. Sawyer Blanks Blue Devils 2-0

Vanceboro's Keitt Sawyer blanked the Smyrna Blue Devils on two hits Tuesday and his team mates scored two unearned runs in the first inning to give Vanceboro a 2-0 win over the Blue Devils in a game played on the Smyrna diamond.

Sawyer bested Braxton Piner in the pitching duel. Piner, the ace of the Blue Devil staff allowed only three hits, all singles, in losing. The crafty southpaw was tagged for a pair of safeties in the first inning and one in the sixth.

Smyrna's two hits, also singles, were made by Joe Willis and Piner.

Besides giving up two hits, Sawyer struckout 14 and walked one batter. Piner had three strikeouts to his credit and didn't walk a man.

The game closed out the Blue Devil baseball season and left them with a 13-2 record for the year. The Blue Devils had beaten Vanceboro in a previous game.
