Lefty Perry And Fred Sharpe Hold Eagles In Check To Start Semi-Pro Affair

Greensboro, July 1.— (Special)—The Lucky Strike nine from Durham threw a bombshell into pre-tournament predictions here tonight by vanquishing the strong McCrary Eagles from Asheville 7 to 4 in the first game of the state semi-pro tournament. A crowd of approximately 3,000 was on hand as Hans Wagner, one of the greatest players organized baseball ever knew, officially launched the meet by cracking a pitch by former Mayor Pro-Tem Lewis, into the outfield.

Louis Perry, a southpaw, started on the mound for the Luckies but gave way at the end of the third inning after allowing McCrary five hits and two runs in the first round and one in the third. Fred Sharpe, a righthander, finished and limited the Asheville aggregation to three hits the remainder of the way. The McCrary team's lone damage off Sharpe came in the eighth when a single run was scored.
