

Morehead City Divides Twin Bill; Loses 3-2 Wins 6-5

Morehead Stays in First Place as Swansboro Splits Weekend Games! Sunday's Came Won With 4 Runs in 8th Inning—Stoy and Smith Homer

Morehead City and Havelock divided their twin bill over the weekend, Havelock taking Saturday's fray at Havelock, 3-2, in 12 innings, and Morehead winning Sunday's contest in Wade Brothers Park, Morehead City, 6-5.

James Webb was the losing pitcher in Saturday's contest after giving up a tally in the last half of the twelfth inning, breaking a 2-2 tie. Taylor, on the mound for Havelock, received credit for the victory.

In Sunday's game Winkler started for Morehead City but gave way to Piner in the second frame. Piner received credit for the win.

Annis started for Havelock, but was relieved by Gaskins in Morehead's big eighth inning. Gaskins was charged with the loss but was more a victim of scoring rules rather than Morehead's offensive. Although he gave up only one run, it was the winning run, and so he got stuck with the loss.

Morehead City went back to its weird way of winning ball games with a mass of runs at the last minute, after being completely stalled for most of the game. Morehead scored two runs in the seventh and four more in the eighth to come from behind and take a victory away from pitcher Annis.

Annis had been moving along steadily, giving up five hits in the first six innings of the contest and completely blanking his foe up to that point. In the meantime, his mates had methodically pecked away at the two Morehead pitchers for runs in the second, third, fifth, and sixth innings to lead, 4-0.

Havelock's first run came when Fauvelle singled, stole second, and then took third when the catcher threw wild. An error by third baseman Smith on a grounder by Kohlbecker allowed Fauvelle to score. When the next batter, GERAL, hit safely, manager Jack Gardner replaced Winkler with Piner, who put out the fire.

Havelock took to Piner in the next inning. Robinson doubled and took third when Stillway erred on Fauvelle's bouncer. A hit by Wright then made it 2-0.

The fifth inning saw Havelock score another tally and threaten to score more by loading the sacks, although they did this without a single base hit. Robinson walked and took second on an infield out, following a walk to Wright. Kohlbecker got on through an error, scoring Robinson. A hit batter then filled the bases before Piner could end the inning by fanning GERAL.

An error by the first baseman, Tenney, and a two-bagger by Robinson accounted for Havelock's marker in the sixth session.

While Havelock was satisfied to score its runs one at a time, Morehead City was forced once more to do it in bunches. A two-run outburst in the seventh put them back into the ball game, 4-2.

Malphus started things rolling by socking a blooper single into center field. He reached second on an infield out and scored on Beane's single. Beane taking second on the throw-in to the plate. A single by Salter brought in Beane with the second run.

For the sake of protection, Havelock scored another tally in the

top half of the eighth. Hodges singled and took second on Lockey's hit. Blevins forced Lockey at second base, but when shortstop Stillway threw wild past first base in an attempt to complete a double play, Hodges scored, making it 5-2.

One run wasn't protection enough, however, and the Morehead City boys really went to town on Annis in the lower half of the eighth.

Stoy, first man up, socked Annis' first pitch over the right center field wall for a home run. Gardner then sent a long blast into center field for his second double of the day and the ball game was tied up when Smith, swinging at the first pitch, pickled the horsehide clear over the center field wall for the inning's second homer. Annis knew he was through at this point, and began walking off the mound as the Havelock manager started out of the dugout to tell him the bad news. Gaskins was sent in to finish the inning.

He finished it all right, but not before Morehead finished Havelock and pinned the loss on Gaskins. Malphus walked and was sacrificed to second by Tenney. A single by Beane brought in Malphus and sewed up the ball game for Morehead City.
