

## Atlantic Boys, White Oak Girls Win Games Tuesday

The Atlantic Pirates and White Oak split a doubleheader at Atlantic Tuesday night. The White Oak lassies won a 46-43 decision on a last-minute mistake by Atlantic. In the second game the Pirates had no trouble in winning a 34-42 verdict.

The Atlantic lassies were one point ahead with a minute to go when Coach Roy Cockerham ordered them to freeze the ball. An Atlantic forward let the ball get away from her and fouled a White Oak player in a scramble for the ball. White Oak scored the free throw to tie up the game and took the ball out of bounds. White Oak hit on a field goal and drew one more foul from Atlantic in the final seconds of play.

**Atlantic Ahead**  
Atlantic held a 26-22 lead at the end of the first half and had a 23-22 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Rita Gilgo topped the Atlantic forwards, scoring 13 points for the winners. Jane Goodwin scored four and Anita Brown scored seven. Brenda Salter, Katy Gilkin and Jean Fulkner played the guard positions for Atlantic.

Goodwin was high scorer for the White Oak lassies. She hit for 38 points, even with two Atlantic guards on her for part of the game. Collins scored six points and Talmah added two to the White Oak total. White Oak guards were Aman, Jones and Hewitt.

It was a different story in the boys game. The Pirates took a 13-11 lead in the first quarter and ran the score to 34-24 at the half.

**Reserves Go In**  
In the third quarter Coach Cockerham used his reserves and Atlantic scored only one point. White Oak only hit for six points, so the Pirates held a 35-30 lead at the beginning of the final quarter.

The Atlantic starters went into the game in the fourth period and scored 19 points while holding White Oak to 12. Coach Cockerham said that his first team had a bad night, but that he was proud of the way his freshmen came through. Robby Nelson was the leading point getter for Atlantic with 19 points. Roger Harris hit for 11, Sammy Salter got nine, Stevie Mason got eight and George Golden scored seven.

Yancy was the high point man for White Oak with 20 points. Hudley got eight, Simms hit for six, Banks got four, and Rochelle and Parker hit for two each.

## Morehead City Lassies Beat Newport, 59-49

A good game isn't always the most exciting. The Morehead City Eagles and the Newport Hawks proved that Tuesday night at Morehead City. The Eagles pulled it out of the fire by a 57-53 margin and most of the fans were as excited as though they were at a State-Carolina game.

Both coaches agreed that their teams played rather poorly, but they also agreed that it was a great game for the spectators. Newport grabbed an early lead and held a 12-10 advantage after three minutes of play.

The Eagles battled back and trailed by two, 12-11, at the end of the first quarter. The Hawks scored six quick points in the second quarter and held a 19-12 lead with five minutes left in the first half.

When the half ended the Eagles had moved up to trail by four, 21-19.

The Eagles tied the score after three minutes had elapsed in the third quarter. Walter Morris hit a crisp shot on a three on one fast break to raise the score to 28-27 in favor of Newport. He was fouled on the shot and made a free throw good to tie the score, 28-28.

Newport regained the lead on a free throw by Johnny Mason. The Eagles tied the score again at 33-33 with three minutes left in the quarter.

**Eagles Move Ahead**  
Darden Eure put the Eagles ahead for the first time in the game with a free throw. Morris added a crisp shot and a free throw to run the score to 35-33 in favor of the Eagles.

Jimmy Swann hit on a fast break and was fouled as he shot. He made the free throw good and moved the score up to 40-33. With two seconds left in the period the Hawks tried to get the ball down the court in a hurry. Llewellyn Phillips intercepted the pass and hit on an easy shot to give the Eagles a 42-33 lead at the end of the quarter.

With a little less than four minutes to go, the Eagles held a 10-point lead, 51-41. A strong rally by the Hawks pulled them up to a three-point deficit. They trailed by 56-53 seven with 11 seconds to go.

**His First Shot**

Morris shared top scoring honor with Phillips as he hit for 16 points. Eure scored 10, Swann hit for six and John Phillips scored six.

Larry Kirk was the big gun for the Hawks. He scored 15 points and more than Lilly and John Mason, scored nine, Larry Wallat hit for seven. Alton Hardist scored seven and Terpin scored six.

The Hawks hit on 17 of 25 shots from the free throw line for 68 per cent accuracy. The Eagles hit 14 of 24 for 58 per cent accuracy.
