

## Seadogs Hold 14.8 Point Edge Over Opponents

The Beaufort Seadogs, tied for first place in the county standings with Morehead City, have a commanding lead in the statistical department. They hold a 14.8 point per game edge over all opponents. They have averaged 67.2 points per game while holding their opposition to an average of 52.4 points a game.

The Newport Hawks have averaged 68.1 points a game but have given up an average of 56 points per game to a margin of 12.1 points. Atlantic is averaging 65 points a game to 38 points a game for opponents for a spread of seven points a contest.

The Morehead City Eagles are averaging 61.1 points a game to 56.7 points a game for their opponents. That gives them a 4.4 point advantage.
