

Newport Goes Up in Tourney At Havelock

- Hawks Down Jasper 76-50 Wednesday
- Semi-Finals Begin Tonight, Havelock

Newport pounced on Jasper in the Carteret-Craven tournament Wednesday night at Havelock to win by a 26-point margin, 76-50. Newport's Jimmy Mills scored a total of 30 points to make it an easy victory for Newport.

Grabbing a 14-6 lead in the first quarter, Newport stacked up 20-22-20 in the remaining quarters to Jasper's 6-8-22-14 score by periods.

Mills was backed up by Sammy Lilly 14, and Victor Mills, 11. Jasper's Jerry Hodnett got 18 and Jimmy Hill got 12 in the total scoring.

Newport plays the winner of the Atlantic-Smyrna game and the victor will then go to the semi-finals tonight at 7. The conference finals will be Saturday night at 7 for the girls and at 8:30 for the boys.

Newport Senior Chalks Up Season's Top Scoring Record

Property Owner Seeks Permission For Dredging

J. T. Barnes Jr., Mansfield Park, has made application to the Corps of Engineers for a permit to dredge a channel between, the mouth of Jumping Run creek and the intra-coastal waterway west of Morehead City.

The channel will be 100 yards east of the No. 18 navigation marker in Bogue Sound. Dimensions for the channel are 100 feet wide, 1,300 feet long and 6 feet in depth at mean low water. Material dredged will be put on property owned by Mr. Barnes.

Col. R. P. Davidson, district engineer, who announced the application, will receive protests on the dredging until Monday, April 2, as is customary in the issuance of permits.

Plans showing the work are posted in Colonel Davidson's office and the Morehead City postoffice.

Jimmy Mills of Newport has held on to his position as top average scorer in the past basketball season. His 20.9 average points per game make him top man. Mills also held the uppermost position in total points for any one individual regular season game, 37 gathered in the contest against Vanceboro.

Mills, a senior, got a total of 440 points in 21 games, and also led in field goals, making 181 during the season.

was Ray Hassell of Beaufort's Seadogs, with a 17.4 or 332 points in 19 games. Hassell and Wiggins of Swansboro both have total points in the 300 class, and Wiggins leads in free throws.

Two of Morehead City's players rate next, Jimmy Smithwick and George Styron. Smithwick averaged 17.3 or 208 points scored in 12 games. Styron got a total of 219 in 13 games, giving him an average of 16.6.

Mills led the pack in scoring at mid-season.

Freda Kay Garner, Beaufort Guard, Wins Berth on All-Eastern Team

One of Beaufort's top girl basketball players, Freda Kay Garner, a guard, has been named to one of the state's top teams. She has been chosen for the All-Eastern team to play in Forest City Saturday, March 17.

Coach Jim Fodrie was notified of the honor Tuesday.

The eastern team, composed of the top players in the eastern part of the state, will meet the western stars on that date.

Freda Kay is the first of Beaufort's players ever to be named for this honor. In the past she was named to THE NEWS-TIMES All-County team while a sophomore

and a junior, and once to the Carteret-Craven all-conference team. Now a senior, she was chosen "most athletic" in the senior class. She has also served as team captain.

Freda will go to Forest City March 15 and practice for the big game under Raeford Wells, coach of the Aberdeen high school.

The two teams for the annual East-West game carry the same rank in girls' play as the "all-state" team for boys. Members are the guests of the game committee, and all expenses are paid.
