Guy Clodfelter, McCrary shortstop, was the only player performing in the tourney who went to the national tournament last year.

Pushing across a pair of markers in the ninth inning, Pilot Doodle Wilkie's Blues scored a 5 to 4 triumph over Bramham Glenn's Reds last night at Durham Athletic Park in the City League's All-Star contest.

Going into the final frame, the score was tied at three-all. The big inning started off with Dick Pierce, of Erwin, reaching first on an error. Bill Harrison, of Coca-Cola, fanned and Dodson Freeman, of Coca-Cola, was hit by the pitcher. Bob Fortune, of Wright's grounded out second to first and Lyndon Roberts, of Coca-Cola, slapped out a neat single to send Pierce and Freeman home. He was thrown out going to second on the throw-in.

The Blues took a 2-0 lead in the fourth and fifth inning. This lead was shortlived, however, as the Wilkiemen registered a trio of runs in the seventh inning. Lefty Perry held Hillsboro to seven hits, three of them, one a double, by Johnny Clayton, sensational young Statesmen second baseman. The local hurler, however, received poor support, seven errors being committed. The Bulls touched Johns for 10 blows with Carson, Hawkins, Parrish and Crabtree getting two apiece. Hillsboro scored two runs in the ninth to tie the score but the Bulls came back in their half of the same round to triumph, Carson hitting into deep leftfield with the sacks full to end the contest.
