

Smyrna Takes Doubleheader At White Oak, 54-36, 51-43

Smyrna's basketballers journeyed to White Oak Tuesday night and returned home with a double victory, by scores of 54-36 and 51-43.

The feature contest found both teams tied at 8 at the end of the initial quarter, with Smyrna forging ahead 21-17 at halftime.

At the end of three quarters the Smyrna quintet continued to lead 36-33, and they iced the game in the final canto as they outscored the hometeam 18-3.

Thomas High Scorer

Louis Thomas was high scorer for the victors with 19 points as two teammates, Ronald Styron 17, and Ken Davis 13, also hit for double figures.

For White Oak the big point-maker was Jones with 14 points with Dickerson gaining runnerup honors with 13 markers. Dickerson was injured in practice and played a very short time in the game.

The preliminary contest saw Smyrna enjoy a narrow 11-10 lead at the end of the first quarter, and a 24-20 advantage at halftime.

In the third quarter the Smyrna sextet added to their lead and at the end of the canto were ahead 35-27.

Willis Tops

Gladys Willis was the high scorer of the game for Smyrna with 38 points. Serina Davis made 11 points for the winners.

For the losers Ann Pittman was high with 23 counters with teammate Daphne Goodwin popping in 10 markers.
