## Beaufort Seadogs Outclass Smyrna Blue Devils, 73-48

Three Scadogs scored in the double figures with Butch Hassell leading the scoring parade with 26 points. Pud Hassell hit for 19 and Ray Hassell scored 14.

Butch hit on seven of eight shots from the floor and connected on 12 free throws for his total of 26. The best performance at the free throw line, however, was turned in by Horace Lawrence who hit all nine of his charity tosses.

Lawrence hit on two field goals for a total of 13 points to cop scoring honors for Smyrna. Braxton Piner scored 12 points and Dale Lewis and Curtis Nelson scored cight each. Carroll Itill completed the scoring for Smyrna with seven points.

Allen Autry, Frank Potter and Leon Thomas also broke into the Beaufort scoring column. Autry scored seven, Potter hit five and Thomas added two points.
