Seashore Lead Shared

Red Sox Upset Blues; Carteret Tides Win Two

RONNIE WILLIS, going 5 for 6 with a double, a triple and 6 RBI's, knocked in Ray Toler in the 11th inning to give the Western Red Sox their first victory in a 13-12 win over the previously unbeaten Eastern Blues Sunday afternoon at Smyrna.

Toler walked, for the fifth time of the day, in the top of the 11th, then advanced to second on a fly ball before Willis singled him home. It was Willis's fifth hit of the game.

MANLEY GASKELL hit his second home run of the day in the bottom of the ninth, with 2 runners on, to send the game into extra innings. Another highlight of the game came in the first inning for the Blues when Paul Damren, Braxton Piner and Gaskill hit 3 back-to-back home runs, in that order.

Tommy Vincent pitched nine innings in relief to gain his first mound victory, while Dallas Arthur, pitching in relief of Brad Piner, got his first loss of the season.

THE RED SOX victory over the Eastern Blues puts the Carteret Tides and the Blues into a tie for first place in the Seashore Baseball League. Andy Raynor led the Tides in their two victories this past weekend.

Raynor went 5 for 5, including a home run, 2 doubles, 4 runs and 3 RBI's, to lead the Carteret Tides to a 16-6 win over the Coastal Greys Friday night at Swinson Park. The game was called, at the 11 o'clock curfew, after 7 innings of play.

The strong hitting catcher, Raynor, again led the Carteret Tides to a 6-1 victory over the Salter Path Braves Sunday afternoon at Salter Path. Raynor was 3 for 4 for the day with 2 home runs and 4 RBI's. Brother Jim Raynor went 9 innings for the mound win.
