Pounding three Whiz Kid hurlers for 18 hits, combined with the tive-hit twirling of Fred Taylor. Morehead City thoroughly thumped Marshallberg 17-1 Sunday afternoon at Wade Bros park, By virtue of the easy victory, Morehead City remained tied with Beaufort for first place honors in the Carleret County league race

After giving up a run in the third inning on a walk to "Hard-crab" Lewis, an infield error, and singles by opposing pitcher Frank Wall and John Hamilton, Taylor scattered but two hits the remaining distance. The smooth-working righthander posted five strikeouts and issued three free passes.

Taylor aided his own cause considerably by slamming three consecutive singles to feature Morehead's attack on starter and loser Wall, Bill Crocker, and lack Ross. Haywood Kelly and cleanup man Tom Benton also had a tine day at the plate. Kelly clouting two singles and a triple good for four runs, and Benton collecting three singles in six trips, plating two tables.

Skinny Ellis, Carl Anderson and leadoff man Bill. Holt followed with 2-5, 2-5, and 2-6, respectively. Ellis knocked in three runs as did Holt, Anderson scored four times.

Only in the fourth and eighth innings did Manager Bill Tuttle's nine fail to score, and only in the eighth did they fail to hit. Morehead opened up with two runs, added four in the second, one in the third, five in the lifth, chasing. Wall, came back with four in the sixth off Crocker, and concluded with a singleton in the seventh utlyoning Rose.

Of the Whiz Kid pitchers, schoolboy fastballer Rose proved the most effective, allowing one run on two hits. He struck out tour in his two inning mound stint. Crocker, the stylish lefthander who lost the heartbreaker to Beaufort last week, didn't have it Sunday, giving up four runs on four hits in the sixth after relieving Wall.

Wall, however, received the lossbeing tagged for 12 runs on 72 hits during the first five trames. Anderson started the beginning of Wall's end by receiving a life on Don Coates' miseue at short, went to third on Taylor's second bingle, and scored on Holt's bounder to short.
