

#33B Continued 1950 June 27 Tidewater League — Morehead Beats Beaufort Twice

The second game Sunday saw Morehead continuing its scoring spree while Beaufort managed only one run off pitcher James Webb. Near perfect fielding by Webb's teammates robbed Beaufort of what should have been several more than the four hits marked up to the team's credit.

Stoy was outstanding on defense for Morehead with his fast work at shortstop that contributed to two double plays. In addition, his cohorts walloped the ball around for 15 hits, two of them homers by Petroff and Fitzgibbons in the sixth. Wallace tapped a triple in the first that drove in two runs.

Kelly led Morehead's batting percentages with four for six. Other hitters were Petroff, three for five,

Wallace, two for five, and Holt and Stoy with two for six each. All four of Beaufort's hits were scattered between Gilikin, Jefferson, Russell and Applegate.

Webb was winning pitcher and was relieved by Hole in the eighth. Jefferson started for Beaufort and was relieved with one third of the first gone after Morehead had driven in several runs.

He was credited with the loss

though his teammates shared in the losing side with three extremely costly errors in the first. That defeated his fair pitching job.
