Morehpad City's Eagles have run roughshod over their first six opponents, and the Newport Hawks have been victorious in 9 of 10 outings. losing only to Dover in a nonconference tif.

The Eagles have the high scorer of the year in Wayne Cheek, 6 foot 7 inch center. At this writing he has made 187 points, and from all indications he wil! set a new scoring record in county and conference play.
