

Morehead Shuts Out Jones Central Friday

Morehead City won its first baseball game of the season Friday when it dumped a visiting Jones Central team 5-0.

It was the first conference game for the Eagles, who dropped two previous contests to Camp Lejeune.

With a conference win under their belt, the Eagles will be taking on their second Coastal Plains foe today when they try the Seadogs of Beaufort.

The Eagles got started in the first inning when they pushed across three runs. Danny McQueen started the rally with a triple, short-stop John Lee contributed a single that got McQueen safely across the plate.

With one aboard, catcher Eddie Smith stepped to the plate and blasted a home run, giving the Eagles a 3-0 edge, on which they

would never be headed.

In the sixth Bernard Leary and Edward Sanderson each scored a run to give the Eagles their shut-out victory.

The Eagles collected six hits, while Leary limited the Jones-Central lads to four hits. Leary went all the way for the Eagles.

The dam broke in the fifth inning when the Seadogs scored five runs and repeated the feat in the sixth by scoring another five.

In the fifth, Johnny Hassell led off with a double, Woodard singled, Merrill collected a one-base hit, Leslie Croom and Richard Stanley got aboard on a fielder's choice.
