

BEAUFORT — Spectators at the Carteret Nets-Eastern Grays game Saturday saw a top-notch baseball contest. Jim Lewis, Grays' pitcher, swatted two solo homers for his team, going 4 for 5 at bat and driving in 3 runs. Grays' Crawford Pigott and Vince Becton drove in 3 runs each.

The Grays were spurred on by a 6-run, fourth-inning surge, holding the Nets at 10-3 until bottom of the ninth. In the last inning, with none out and two on, Nets' Ed Morris hit a towering homer to left field. However, an advance runner, Donald Garner, was called out by home plate
