DON KAPPEL WAS THE big man for Marshallberg as he hit two home runs, one a two-run shot in the first inning. Stanek Minton also had a home run, a three-run blast in the seventh. Other hitters for the Eagles were Rick Heal, 2-4; Lester Murphy, 1-4, with 2 RBI's; and Phillip Golden, 1-4.

Getting hits for the Seas were Ted Tate, 2-4; Perry Goodwin, 3-5; Hubert Brohawn, 2-5; Ronnie Gillikin, 2-3; and Clyde Styron, 1-4, with 2 RBI's.
