Beaufort played host to Newport Friday night in the season's most thrilling doubleheader. The Beaufort sextet won the preliminary 45-44, and the Hawks eked out a 47-45 victory in the feature contest.

After taking a 18-7 lead at the end of the first quarter, the Seadog attack slacked off in the second quarter and

they led at halftime by the narrowest of margins, 21-20. Beaufort continued to lead at the end of the third quarter by the single point margin, 37-36, but a last quarter uprising by the Hawks won the game.

Jimmy Davis of Beaufort had three fouls called on him early in the first quarter and he sat it out until the start of the second half. Davis wound up with high scoring honors for the contest with 18 points, in what was probably his finest game of the season.

Leston Gilikin paced the winners with 12 points, with teammates Berlyn Temple 11, and Eugene Edwards 10, also hitting in double figures.

Seadogs Take Lead

Beaufort jumped out to a 2-0 lead at 6:15 of the first quarter as Jimmy Owens laid one in. Gil Garner and Berlyn Temple each made good on free throw conversions to knot the count at 2'at 5:14.

From that point until the end of the quarter Beaufort dominated the scoring with Jimmy Davis chipping in six points.

After the Scadogs had moved out

ing a 11-9 lead at the end of the first quarter. At halftime the score was knotted at 22 and at the end of the third quarter the teams remained deadlocked at 34.

The final quarter saw the Beaufort sextet gain a three-point lead at 2:50 but this was overcome and the Newport girls took over the lead with 22 seconds remaining in the contest.

Goodwin's last ditch effort won the game for Coach Hugh Gordon's sextet.

The score was tied at 11, 13, 16, 20, 22, 26, 28, 32, 34, 36 and 42.

Peggy Williams was the high scorer of the game for the winning Beaufort lassies with 24 points with runner-up honors going to teammate Shirley Piner with 13 markers.
