Big Baseball Show Sunday

This coming Sunday is the day of the biggest summer sports show in the county — the day of the County League All-Star baseball game.

In this, the first year of operation of the league, the game will be held at Smyrna on the Blue Devil high school diamond, the most attractive baseball facility in the county.

Participating in the All-Star game will be all six teams of the league, Beaufort, Smyrna, Havelock, Salter Path, Newport and Broad Creek. Each team manager will select six players from his roster to make up the two squads.

For the purpose of the All-Star game the league will be divided into eastern and western sections with the east All-Stars playing the west All-Stars. Teams in the eastern division will be Beaufort, Smyrna and Salter Path and Havelock, Newport and Broad Creek will make up the western division.

Managers for the two teams will be selected in this manner: The manager of the team that is in first place in the league standings on July 3 will handle the eastern team and the manager of the fourth place team on July 3 will manage the western entry. Since the game is being played at Smyrna the eastern division will be the home team.

No admission will be charged for the game, so those of you who think you would enjoy a real old-fashioned afternoon at the ball park should make your plans now to attend. The Smyrna field is one of the most beautiful spots to be found in Carteret county and has plenty of tall pine trees around it to offer shade to those who don't like to sit in the sun while watching a ball game.

Another added attraction will be the County League Baseball Queen contest which will be held immediately prior to the game starting at 12:30. Twelve of the loveliest girls around will compete for the title of County League Baseball Queen.

The 12 entries in the contest will be Jenny Johnson, Sue Bordeaux and Beth Mayo of Morehead City; Grace Wilson and Mary Sue Willis of Salter Path; Peggy Bradenaw and Sara Gery of Beaufort; Betty Lou Lewis, Joan Salter and Portia Salter of Broad Creek, Barbara Jean Hill of Marshallberg, and Billy June Pittman of Havelock.

The girls will be judged in bathing suits and the panel of judges will consist of Jarvis Herring, Beaufort; Nathan Garner, Newport and Jo Ann Parsons of Morehead City. Miss Parsons was Miss Morehead City of 1956-60. Another judge will be named to the panel this week. Ray Cummins of Beaufort will act as master of ceremonies for the beauty contest.

Providing the music for the beauty contest and the baseball game, too, will be George Jackson of the Carolinians.

A concession stand selling soft drinks and snacks will

be open.

The beauty contest will get under way at 12:30 and will be followed by the baseball game at 2:30, so plan now to get there early. Baseball is America's national pastime and like the Old Fireballer, Dizzy Dean, says, "It's fun to be a fan."
