## Reid Kennedy Pitches, Hits for Morehead Win

Morehead City high school downed Newport 8-3 Friday on the Hawks' home field. It was the Eagles' second win of the season against four losses.

Reid Kennedy was the winning pitcher, going the distance. He struck out nine, walked one and gave up 10 hits. Jimmy Aycock went all the way for Newport to get the loss. He struck out nine Eagles, walked two and allowed 10 hits.

Morehead City scored three runs in the first inning. Eddie Smith led off with a single, and moved to second on a sacrifice bunt by Mike Clapsadl. Howard Barnum was hit by a pitched ball to join Smith on base, and both men scored on a triple by the pitcher, Reid Kennedy. A single by Mickey Brown scored Kennedy.

The Eagles picked up two more runs in the third inning. Ernest Ballance singled. He made it to second while Barnum reached first on an error, and a double by the pitcher drove both men in.

Newport put two on the scoreboard in the third inning. Dwayne Oglesby singled, then came home

on a home run by Sammy Lilly. The Hawks' Tony Minatel also got a hit in the third, but was unable to score.

Danny Clapsadl singled for Morehead City in the fourth inning, and was joined on base by Eddie Smith. Mike Clapsadl doubled in both men to boost the Eagles' lead to 7-2. They picked up their eighth run in the fifth inning on singles by Kennedy and Mike McBride.

Newport made its final tally in the seventh inning. Lilly singled, and scored on a double by Minatel.
