

Livingston's Seventh-Inning Double Gives Hawks 11-10 Win Over Smyrna

The Newport Hawks handed the Blue Devils a surprising 11-10 defeat Thursday at Smyrna on a seventh-inning double by Billy Livingston. The hit scored the tying run, then the clincher.

Jimmy Aycock started on the mound for Newport, and was relieved in the fifth inning by Ted Winberry.

The relief pitcher struck out four men in the final two innings, pushing the Hawks strike-out total to nine.

Kenny Lewis, a sophomore at Smyrna, was the losing pitcher.

A homer by Sammy Lilly and a double by Norman Dunn highlighted Newport's victorious afternoon, despite five errors.

Coach Fred Bartholomew, Smyrna, cited lack of practice (because of rain) as the main reason for the Devils' "weak defense and weak pitching. We've got to improve," he added, "because we can't get any worse."

Newport picked up 13 hits to Smyrna's nine.
