After trailing by six points at 27-21 at intermission on the ball. the Rebels made a determined effort to overhaul Beanfort as they matched the Big Green almost point for point in the third quarter.

There were only four seconds showing on the clock when Butch Hassell sank the last of his many field goals for Beaufort high school. The bucket ran the score to 68=42 and closed the book on the Seadogs' successful bid on defending the state title they won at Winston-Salem in 1959.

Trailing Butch in the scoring department for the game were Pud and Ray Hassell who had 18 and 11 points respectively. This marked the third time in the tournament that the three Hassell cousins had outscored the entire opposing teams. Chuck Lewis, called into action when Pud got into foul trouble, finished the night with six points.
