

# Butch Hassell Given All-State Honors

Beaufort's Butch Hassell, who sparked the Seadogs to two consecutive state basketball titles, capped off a brilliant high school career Sunday by being named on the 1960 Greensboro Daily News All-State team.

Butch, who has been a starter for coach Tom McQuinn ever since he first came out for basketball as a freshman, was among ten players selected for

Pod Hassell's highest scoring performance of the year was 23 points against Atlantic in the Seadogs' 87-62 win over the Pirates.

The lowest total Butch Hassell was held to during the regular season was 13 points in the Beaufort-Atlantic game.

Once again, the team was made up of a majority of players from the larger schools in the state. Five players from 4-A schools were selected as well as three from 3-A schools and two from 1-A. The other 1-A eager selected was Jonesville's 6-6 Howard Pardue.

The Daily News stated that a player's all-around ability was considered in selecting the team. Most all of the players own scoring averages in the 20-point plus category with Pardue topping all scorers with a 28-point per game average.

In his senior year at Beaufort, which many basketball fans call his greatest, Butch again was the team's top point maker, getting 537 points during the regular season. In the state tournament at High Point Butch put together nights of 30, 33 and 19 points for a tourney average of 27.3.

He led the Beaufort quintet to their second straight state championship as they breezed through three opponents to run their undefeated string to 51 games.

The other players named to the All-State team were Barry Benfield of Hudson; Richard Carmichael of High Point; Mike Cooke of Mount Airy; Terry Holland of Clinton; Bob Jamieson of Greensboro; Eddie Kesler of Salisbury; Fred Neal of Burlington; Howard Pardue of Jonesville; and Terry Ronner of Wilmington.

### Highest Individual Scoring

The highest individual scoring performance for a Beaufort player this year was the 50 points Butch Hassell scored Feb. 12 against Newport in the Seadogs' 99-48 win over the Hawks.

Calvin Jones' highest point output for a single game was 12 points which he scored against Havelock in the Seadog's 60-31 triumph over the Rams.
