### Duke's Heavy Hitting Too Much For Carolina

Bennett and Kistler Get Circuit Blows For Blue Devils

JENKINS ALLOWS 5 HITS

Devils Bombard Two Tar Heel Hurlers for 15 Hits; House Gets Two Homers and Jackson One

Carolina was able to get only five hits off the delivery of Lefty Jenkins and were set down by the score of 9 to 6 at the hands of the hard and often-hitting Blue Devils.

Carolina started off with a rush by scoring four markers in the first two innings as a result of two home runs with one man on each time. But the Blue Devils showed their teeth and started hitting the ball all over and out of the lot while Jenkins grew more and more stingy with his hits. The game was played on Hanes Field last Saturday afternoon before a crowd of about 4,000 spectators.

By hitting two Tar Heel pitchers, Ball and Fleming, for a total of fourteen hits and giving air-tight support behind star pitching, the Duke team showed supremacy throughout the contest. Duke's first scoring came in the second inning when Tom Bennett hit a long drive over center-field fence following "Red" Murray's single. Another came in the third on Adam's double, a base on balls, and two singles by Werber and Murray respectively. Another came in the fourth due chiefly to Jenkins' double into deep right. In the fifth, Duke tied the score and stepped out into a two run lead. During the first part of the inning with one man on base, Kistler made the longest home run of the afternoon by driving the ball twenty feet over the center-field wall. Ball was then relieved in favor of right-hander Fleming, who fared no better at the hands of the Duke sluggers. Hawkins, who bats left-handed, was sent to bat for Bennett. The change resulted in a two-bagger which made two men on base. Nick Warren then golfed one over the right-fielder's head for a three bagger, sending in the two men on bases and making the score 8 to 6 in Duke's favor.

### Wright's Tops Erwin In Upset

Downey Drives In Winning Run, 7-6

Catcher Downey's single scoring Second Baseman Hunt in the top half of the 10th inning brought Wright's Automatic an upset victory over Erwin Auditorium in the City League playoff series in Durham Athletic Park last night. The score was 7-6.

Pitcher Bradley scattered nine Erwin hits in besting Bennett.
