

Hawks End Regular Season Tuesday With 3-0 Win Over Camp Lejeune

Will Play Elimination Game at Bath Monday

Newport ended its regulation baseball season Tuesday, with a 3-0 victory over Camp Lejeune. The win, at Newport, gives the Hawks a 5-7 record.

But they defeated Smyrna, the county's only other single-A school, in the teams' two meetings, to claim the county title. Newport will travel to Bath Monday for

a single elimination game, the first step to the state playoffs.

Leo Winberry was the winning pitcher Tuesday, boosting his record to 4-3 in regular season play. He went the distance, striking out four, walking three and allowing two hits. The team committed no errors. According to coach Eugene Edwards, "We finally got through one game without any."

The losing pitcher was Land, who went all the way. He struck out 11, walked one and gave up four hits. The Devilpups committed three errors.

The Hawks scored all three runs in the fifth inning. Cecil Hardesty singled, and went on to second on a sacrifice bunt by Norman Dunn. Winberry walked, and Oglesby singled, while Hardesty scored on a throwing error by the Lejeune right fielder.

Jimmy Aycock singled to bring home Winberry and Oglesby. Hardesty singled in the sixth inning, and went around to third after the ball got by Lejeune's left fielder, but couldn't get home.

The visitors threatened in the fifth and seventh innings. Sellers and Turville walked, and Zadai singled in the fifth. But Sellers was thrown out at the plate. In the seventh, Turville and Zadai walked. But Vain slammed a ball to shortstop, hitting Turville and causing the third out.

Coach Edwards called the game one of Newport's best defensively. "We didn't get many hits, but we got them when we needed them," he said.

Undefeated Havelock took the Smyrna Blue Devils for a 10-1 ride Tuesday at Smyrna. The loss cuts the Devils' record to 6-5.

Joe Laufer was the winning pitcher. He went the distance, striking out 13, walking three and giving up six hits. Kenny Lewis, who was relieved in the sixth inning by Keith Piner, got the loss. Together, they struck out four, walked four and allowed the Rams 13 hits.

Havelock committed one error to Smyrna's two.

The visiting Rams scored four runs in the third inning, on five singles, a double and an error. They added one more in the fourth, on two singles and a double, and picked up three runs in the fifth, on a walk, a double and a home run by Dickie Timmons with one man on.

In the seventh, Havelock brought home another two, on a walk, two hits and an error.

Smyrna scored its one run in the fourth. Norris Nelson tripled, and came home on a single by Tommy McGee.
