

Newport Hosts Undefeated Morehead Tonight in Season's Outstanding Tilt

Morehead City's undefeated Eagles journey to Newport tonight for what should be the game of the season.

The Eagles have an 11-0 mark and the Newport Hawks are likewise undefeated against conference and county opponents, sporting a 13-1 record.

The preliminary game of the doubleheader will get underway at 7 p.m.

Newport is normally a tough team to beat on their home-court. Tonight will be no exception.

Coach Gannon Talbert of Morehead City said, "I hope that we can win, and though the game rates as a toss-up I feel that my boys will come through."

Coach Bob King of Newport remarked, "It will be a tough game, and though I don't make any forecasts, I'll see it for a one-point victory."

Eagles Undefeated

The Eagles have taken their first 11 games by overwhelming scores, but they expect their hardest battle tonight. The Hawks have a winning streak of nine straight on the line.

Pacing the Morehead City five will be Wayne Cheek who has averaged better than 30 points per game. The 6-7 center of the Eagles has been equally adept at tapping, his overhead jump shot, and in clearing the boards.

Craig Horne, backcourt star, will be back in action tonight after missing a pair of contests. His ball handling is beautiful. He's expected to share honors with Cheek.

Three Pace Hawks

Leading the attack for the Hawks will be Lester Gillikin, Berlyn Temple and Eugene Edwards. Gillikin has a better than 17 points per game average and is the big man under the boards for the Hawks.

Temple and Edwards are both fine shots from the outside, with Temple sporting a 16-point per game average and Edwards scoring better than 11 points per game.
