The Hawks jumped to an early 1-0 lead in the first inning when Wayne Oglesby drew a walk. Billy Livingston followed with a free trip to first on a walk.

Oglesby got into scoring position by stealing third and Skip Johnson got a base hit that drove in Oglesby.

The Blue Devils came to bat in the first inning and produced two runs. Byron Styron, the Blue Devil pitcher, drew a walk. Catcher Joe Willis was safe at first on an error.

Ken Lewis got a base hit. A walk by the Newport pitcher allowed Styron to come in for one run and Sterling Hancock got a base hit and drove in the second run.

Newport scored again in the top of the second to tie the score at 2-2. Smyrna went ahead to stay in the same frame by scoring one run and they marked again in the fourth.

It was the first game in their last four games that the Blue Devils have been held to less than 10 runs. Also it was the first time in their last four that they have given up more than one run.

Leo Winberry was the losing pitcher. He went all the way for the Hawks, giving up six hits, walking three and fanning eight.

Power Will be Off Twice Sunday Morning

Two power interruptions will occur throughout the county Sunday morning, according to George Stovall, manager of Carolina Power and Light Co., Morehead City.

There will be a 10-minute interruption at 5 a.m. and another 10-minute interruption at 7 a.m.

The purpose is to install new lightning protective equipment on the 110,000-volt substation at Morehead City. The work will be done only if weather permits, Mr. Stovall said.
