Beaufort and Harkers Island-Straits divided their twin bill over the weekend, Harkers Island took Saturday's game at Beaufort, 13.5, but dropped Sunday's tilt at Harkers Island; 5.2.

Footsey Palmer of rootbalf fame started and went the route for Harkers Island, and just about won the whole game by himself. Roger Thrift started for Beaufort and was the loser. He was relieved by Charles Pinnochio in the second.

In Sunday's affair at Harkers Island, Stanley Johnson notched his first victory in a Beaufort uniform by three hitting the big bats of the foe. His opponent on the mound was Carl Anderson.

Tracy Hooper highlighted the Beoufort offense with a home run with no one on base.

Saturday's slugtest saw Palmer win the game for Harkers Island-Straits almost single-handedly. Besides holding Beaufort at bay with his pitching, Palmer singled, doubled, tripled and homered in five times at bat. The home run came with the bases loaded.

Harkers Island made it 9-4 with three in the sixth session. Pigott singled and was safe at second when Verbanic erred on Davis' grounder. Anderson's hit loaded the bases and another single by Dave Yeomans brought a run in to score. With the bases still full, Palmer walked, forcing in a run, and when Hawkins bunted, the third run of the inning came across the dieb.

Beaufort retaliated feebly with a run in the lower half of the same frame. Hester reached first via shortstop Pigott's boot and got to the keystone sack by pilfering it. Hassell's single brought in Hester.
