

# Salter Path Wins Pair In County League Play

Salter Path swept its twin-bill Sunday in County League play at their home diamond as they defeated Morehead City by counts of 10-8 and 14-4.

In other action Sunday Smyrna-Harkers Island and the Agassiz split their two games at Beaufort with the Smyrna-HI team winning the first 14-12, and dropping the second 8-3.

## Atlantic Wins

At Newport the slugging Atlantic crew won the first game 6-1, and then the second contest was called off because of the curfew with both teams knotted at 13 all at the end of seven innings.

At the end of the second Sunday of play Atlantic leads the league with a record of 3-0, Smyrna-HI is in second spot with a record of 3-1, Salter Path is tied with Beaufort as both teams show a .500 record, with Salter Path at 2-2, and Beaufort 1-1.

Morehead City and the Agassiz have identical records of 1-3, and Newport is down in the cellar at this writing with an 0-1 record.

The league leaders defeated Newport at the losers diamond Sunday in the first contest behind the five-hit hurling of Don Willis. Losing pitcher was Earl Morton.

Each of the teams committed a pair of miscues in each of the games.

At Salter Path the Tye Frost team took advantage of several errors in the sixth inning of the first game to take a 10-8 victory after trailing 8-7 going into the inning.

Winning pitcher for the game was Bobby Martin and the loss was chalked up by Mel Adecock.

In the second contest the Salter Path team made 14 runs on 16 hits to win the game 14-4. Smith was the winning hurler for Salter Path with the loss going to Chuck Hall, who was relieved by a succession of would-be hurlers.

Leading batsman in the game

was Pure H Jones of Salter Path who had 5-6.

Other games: at Beaufort, Smyrna-Harkers Island won the opener 14-12 with O. C. Lawrence being credited with the win. The loss was chalked up by Franklin.
