

Atlantic Regains Top Position In Loop with Twin Victories

Atlantic and Morehead City swept their twin-bills on Sunday in the County League, with Newport splitting their doubleheader against Smyrna-Harkers Island.

The double victory by the John Hamilton team enabled the Atlantic All-Stars to regain first place in the loop standings, with Smyrna dropping back to second, and Morehead City taking undisputed possession of third.

Newport is in the fourth slot at present with Beaufort and the Agassiz tied for the cellar spot.

Don Willis pitched Atlantic to victory in the initial contest winning 3-1. Herb Mason was the loser for the Beaufort nine.

In the second contest Atlantic took a 7-3 decision with Gary Morris the winner and Frank Garner being charged with the loss.

Leading the hitting attack for the twin-bill for Atlantic were Jack Rose, Buddie Willis and Joe Willis, each of whom had 3-8.

Langdale Leads Beaufort

For the losers Frank Langdale led the attack with 4-6, with L. Woodard having 3-7 and Herb Mason 2-4.

At Newport the cellar team rose up in the first of two to defeat the Smyrna-HI nine by a 5-4 count. In the nightcap Smyrna-HI turned the tables winning an 11-6 victory.

Tom Culpepper went all the way for Newport in the first game to rack up the win, with the loss going to Wilson (no-hit) Davis, who was one of three hurlers used in the game.

In the second contest Clayburn Murphy was the winner for the Smyrna-HI team, with the loss going to Earl Morton. Relieving Mur-
