

Seadogs Beat Swansboro In Twin Bill Wednesday

Beaufort won a doubleheader at the home court Wednesday night from the Swansboro Pirates, taking the feature contest 45-39 and the preliminary 53-44.

Neither of the contests was a runaway as Swansboro gave the Seadogs fits in both contests.

Man-to-Man Defense

The feature ballgame saw the Pirates utilize a man-to-man defense on the small Beaufort court, and thereby hold the score down.

At the end of the first quarter Beaufort led 7-6, but at halftime Swansboro took over the lead at 17-15. After being tied at 19, 21 and 23 Beaufort took the lead and led at the end of the quarter 27-24.

Ed Willis was the big gun in the final period assault for the Seadogs as he scored all 9 of his points in the canto.

Davis Scores 10

Jimmy Davis was high scorer for the Seadogs with 12 points, with Jimmy Owens popping in 11 markers. Owens was a tower of strength on defense as he broke up a goodly number of offensive threats by the Pirates.

Dick Kellum was high for the Pirates with 14 markers as Pete Holt scored 9.

After moving out to an 11-3 lead in the early part of the first quarter of the prelim, Beaufort saw its lead dwindle and at the end of the quarter the Beaufort girls had a 13-11 lead. They extended it to 26-23 at halftime.

The third quarter saw the teams knotted at 29 and 31 and at the end of the quarter Beaufort led by the narrowest of margins 38-37.

After being tied twice in the final quarter at 42 and 44, Peggy Williams put on a scoring show in the last five minutes to give the Beaufort girls the victory.

Williams was high pointmaker

for the winners with 30 points a teammate Vonda Goodwin tossed in 12 markers.
