

Atlantic Chalks 12-6 Baseball Win

The Atlantic Pirates opened their baseball season with a win Tuesday afternoon as they banged out seven hits and downed the Newport Hawks 12-6 in a game played on the Atlantic diamond.

Carroll Floyd was the starting pitcher for Roy Cockerham's team and he went the distance limiting the Hawks to four singles. The righthander struck out 11 batters and walked five in registering his first triumph.

Chadwick was the Newport starter. He lasted only four innings, giving up six hits and walking two. He was relieved in the fifth inning by Garner who pitched to five batters and failed to get a man out. Righthander Johnny Turpin came on to finish up and he allowed only one hit in the remaining two innings. Turpin walked three and fanned one.

Atlantic put together single runs in each the first and fourth innings and then exploded for 10 in the fifth. Leading the Pirate attack at the plate was Aubrey Harvey who slammed out two hits in three trips to the plate, including a triple and a bases-loaded double. Harvey was credited with five runs batted in.

Completing the batteries for the two teams were Harvey for Atlantic and Whitaker for Newport.

McQuaid's Teams Win 80 Per Cent of Games Since '47

Two hundred and fifty-five wins against only 63 losses is the record compiled by basketball teams coached by Tom McQuaid during the last 13 years.

School records of the basketball team go back only as far as the

1947-48 season, since previous records were destroyed in the 1946 school fire.

Since the year when the records were renewed, McQuaid has never had a losing season and three of his teams, the 1944-55 team, the 1958-59 team and the 1959-60 team have compiled undefeated records. All three teams were also state champions.

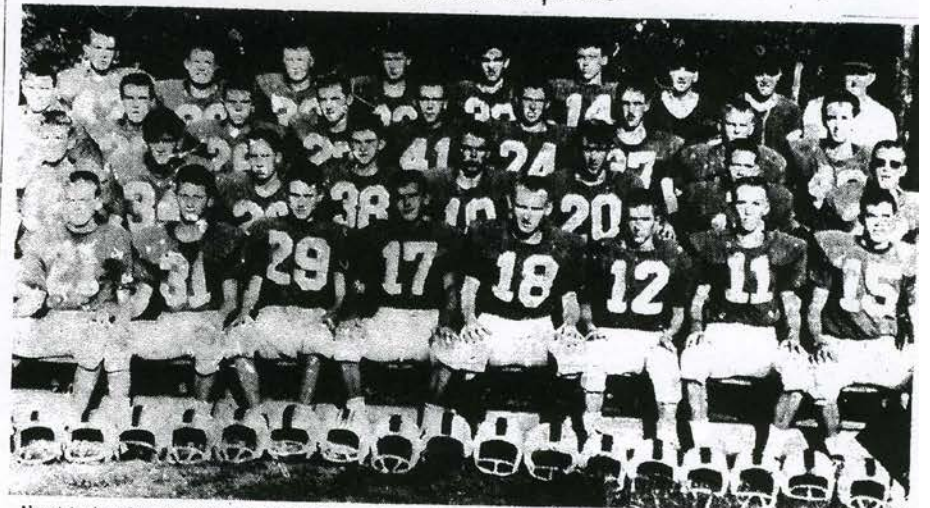
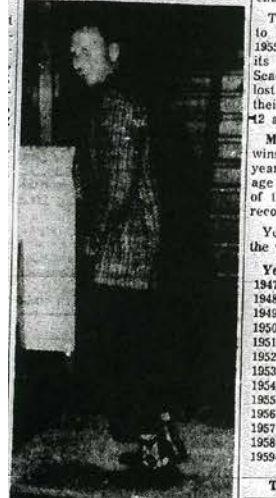
The closest McQuaid ever came to having a losing season was in 1955-56, the year after Beaufort won its first state title. That year the Seadogs won only 12 games and lost 11. In 1947-48 the Seadogs had their second worst year, winning 12 and losing 10.

McQuaid's coaching record of 255 wins and 63 losses over the last 13 years gives him a winning percentage of 80.1 per cent, certainly one of the most outstanding coaching records in the nation.

Beaufort Seadogs Open 1960 Baseball Season

Twenty-three boys were on hand Monday afternoon to answer coach Jim Fodrie's first call to baseball practice at Beaufort high school.

Forced to a late start with their baseball season because of the basketball playoffs, the Seadogs had only three days of practice before their first game yesterday afternoon.

Among the 23 boys reporting were seven lettermen from last year's squad. Included in the list of letter winners is hurler Pud Hassell, outfielder Ray Hassell and third baseman Butch Hassell. The team's leading hitter last year, Bill Morgan, is also reported ready for action.

Veteran Joe Powell is expected to handle most of the catching chores for Fodrie this year and the pitching staff will be rounded out by Frank Sides, Bill Hamilton, Sandy Boswell and Cary Kirk.

Working out in the infield in practice so far have been second baseman Jackie Garner, shortstop Chuck Lewis and first baseman Gerald Temple. William Cole will probably get the starting nod for the other outfield post in addition to Ray Hassell and Bill Morgan.

The Seadogs will play a 12-game schedule, according to Fodrie. Tomorrow they will be at home against the Havelock Rams.

Butch Tops Seadog Scoring Statistics

Butch Hassell, with 82 points in three state tournament games, topped his average for the season to 25.8 points a game for 24 contests. Butch finished his final season on the Seadog varsity with a total of 618 points.

Statistics show that Pud Hassell was the next highest point maker for the undefeated state champs, racking up a total of 362 points in 24 games for an average of 15 per game. The third member of the Hassell trio, sophomore Ray, scored 279 points during the season for an average of 11.6 a game.

Final statistics for the rest of the Seadogs follow. The averages are figured on the basis of the 24 games Beaufort played although some of the players did not play in all the games.
