

Atlantic Wins Twin-Bill Sunday from Morehead

The Atlantic All-Stars strengthened their hold on first place in the County League Sunday as they swept both ends of their twin-bill against Morehead City, winning 6-5, and 14-2.

In other action Sunday the Agassiz and Newport split their pair of games at Beaufort and Beaufort and Salter Path divided their doubleheader.

Newport, Agassiz Split

Newport won the first game from the Agassiz, 6-5, and lost the nightcap 5-3. Salter Path beat Beaufort in the opener 11-2 and dropped the second contest 7-2.

Gary Morris outpitched Mel Adcox in the first game between Atlantic and Morehead City and in the nightcap G. Fulcher outpitched T. C. Bass.

John Hamilton and G. Fulcher were the big stickers for the winners with 4-8 and 3-6 respectively. Jimmy Willis was high man for Morehead City with 2-5.

McCabe was the winner of the first game for Newport with Don Shields loser for the Agassiz. Lloyd Culpepper was the winner for the Agassiz in the nightcap and the loss was chalked up by E. Garner.

Jerry Pittman Wins

Jerry Pittman was credited with the win in the opener for Salter Path against Beaufort, though needing relief from Bobby Bass, with Herb Mason sustaining the loss.

In the second contest Walter Thomas went the distance for the win, with Bobby Martin charged
