

# County All-Star Game Sunday

## Game in Morehead City Features Best Players

The annual All-Star game in the County Baseball League will get underway at Wade Brothers ball field Sunday afternoon at 2:30.

Twenty players will represent the western clubs, Morehead City, the Agassiz, Salter Path and Newport. Eighteen of the best of the eastern clubs, Smyrna-Harkers Island, Atlantic and Beaufort, will furnish the opposition.

### West Has Won

### Three-Inning Limit

No pitcher for either team may pitch longer than three innings. It is expected that the three hurlers who will see action for the East will be Walter Thomas, Gary Morris and Don Coates, with the West having four hurlers, Melvin Adcox, Lloyd Culpepper, Jerry Pittman and Wallace Hill.

Managing the Eastern team will be John Hamilton of Atlantic with Wilson Davis and Hugh Gordon as coaches.

For the Western team the manager will be Tye Frost. Coaches are Earl Sells, Melvin Adcox, new manager of the Morehead City team, and Durwood Hill, manager of the Newport team.

The game promises to be one of the most exciting of recent years. All the batters show high averages and the pitchers have fine records.
