Deer Disease Disappears Lansing, Mich. (AP)—A mysteri-ous disease, which killed more than 130 deer in Michigan in a month this fall, has disappeared. The Mich-igan Conservation Department said It believes the disease was a virus infection which principally covered a five-county area in the heart of Michigan's deer county.
