

Havelock Wins Ninth Tuesday behind Bill B

Undefeated Havelock remained undefeated Tuesday. Bill Burchette pitched a one-hit ball game at Newport to give the Rams an 8-0 victory, their ninth.

Hawks' coach Eugene Edwards explained the loss: "Havelock has a fast team; they can hit;" and, Burchette, "he's great." The winning pitcher struck out 12, walked two and gave up one hit, in the seventh inning.

Leo Winberry, chief of Newport's pitching staff, was the losing pitcher. He went all the way, striking out three, walking none and allowing 11 hits. The Hawks' record to date is 4-4.

Havelock scored one run in the first inning. Tommy Dees singled, and came home on a double by Burchette. The Rams' Brickie Scoggins scored one more in the second, on a single, wild pitch, passed ball and a bad throw.

Buzzelli singled to lead off a fourth-inning rally that scored two runs. He was doubled home by Scoggins, who also scored on a single by Clark Totherow and an error.

The Rams picked up four runs in the fifth inning, on singles by Dees, Burchette and Laufer, a double by Buzzelli, one stolen base and a sacrifice fly. Havelock put two more on base in the

sixth, but were unable to score.

Sammy Lilly came up with the Hawks' only hit of the afternoon, a single in the seventh inning, then stole second. Newport sent men as far as second base in the second and fifth innings, but no farther. (With only one hit, and no runs, a box score is not carried for Newport.)
