

Willis Homers Help Devils Win

Smyrna Drops Dixon Tuesday by 6-1

Joe (Boy) Willis knocked in four runs with homers in the first and fifth innings of Tuesday's game at Dixon to give the big boost in Smyrna's 6-1 victory, the Devils' last game of the season.

Kenny Lewis went the distance to get credit for the win. He struck out seven, walked four and gave up seven hits. The losing pitcher was Foy, who also went the distance, striking out nine, walking three and allowing eight hits.

The Devils committed two errors to Dixon's one. Smyrna's record is 8-6.

Charles Lawrence drew a base on balls in the first inning, and came home on Willis's first home run, a shot over the right field

fence. The home team picked up its only run in the second inning, on a double by Foy and a single by Fisher.

In the fourth, Tommy McGee and Doug Damren reached base on a single and a walk, then scored on a double by Terry Lewis.

Kenny Lewis singled in the fifth to set up the Devils' final two runs. Willis slammed his second homer over the left center field fence, an estimated 360 feet away from the plate.
