Monarchs Split Against J'ville

W. S. King School's Monarchs split a doubleheader with Jacksonville Thursday night at the home court, winning the preliminary contest 27-22, and losing the feature contest, 38-38.

Hampered by a lack of height, with both of his tall men out of action, Coach J. R. Thompson had to go along with a short array and his boys were no match for the Jacksonville team under the boards.

Green was high scorer for the winners with 20 points. Charles Collins was high pointmaker for the Monarchs with 11 markers.

The preliminary contest saw the King School sextet lead all the way, holding a 15-point advantage at one stage of the game. They coasted in the last quarter and thereby made the game reasonably close.

High scorer for the victors was Doris Dudley with 16 points and for Jacksonville Jarman was high with 7 markers.

Knights Drop Two to Bayboro

Queen Street Knights journeyed to Bayboro Thursday night and were soundly trounced in both ends of their twin-bill, losing the feature game 55-35 and the prelim 54-18.

Coach Shad Barrow said that his defense fell to pieces.

At the end of the first quarter, Bayboro held a narrow 12-11 lead but had extended their advantage to 24-14 at halftime. At the end of three quarters Bayboro was coasting with a 43-24 lead.

Joe George was high for the Knights with 10 points with runnerup honors going to Luther Tootle with 7 markers.

Bruce Mann 15 and James Styron 14 were high pointmakers for Bayboro.

The preliminary contest was also close at the end of the first canto with Bayboro ahead 12-10. At halftime, however, they were ahead 30-10, and were never headed.
