Grace Small, Linda Dickinson and Jenelda Garner started the game as guards for the Hawkettes.

The Eaglettes ran up a 10-point lead in the first quarter, 24-14, but a Newport rally in the second quarter cut the margin to four points. The score at the half stood at 33-29.

Hassell scored four points in the first quarter, seven in the second, 10 in the third and seven in the fourth. Phillips hit for eight points in the first, two in the second, nine in the third and eight in the fourth.

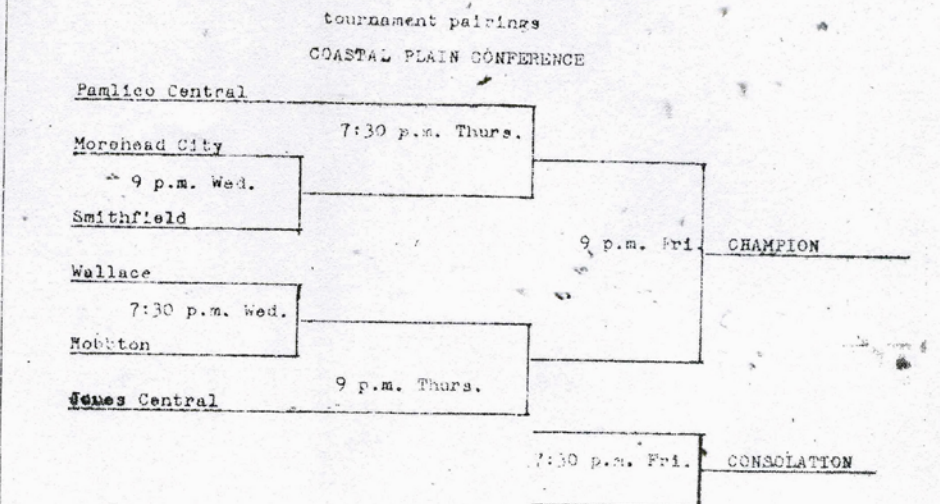
### Beaufort Scorers
