Monarchs Trim Fort Barnwell

W. S. King School's Monarchs returned to winning ways Wednesday night as they swept a doubleheader from Fort Barnwell on the home court. The Monarchs won the feature game in a runaway 72-47, and took the preliminary in a real thriller 33-31.
