Beaufort high school star, Butch Hassell, who, during the regular season, was named to All-County and All-State basketball teams, today was nominated for the annual National High School All-America team by THE NEWS-TIMES.

Butch was named on a ballot received at the newspaper office to select the outstanding high school basketball player during the past season from this area. The team is sponsored by the Wigwam Wisemen of America of Oklahoma City.

In leading the Beaufort Scadogs to two consecutive state basketball titles. Butch rewrote every scoring record in the Beaufort book. Dur-

ing the last two years of Butch's high school career, the Seadogs went undefeated, winning 51 straight games.

Scoring statistics for Butch's final year show that the senior Seadog scored a total of 618 points in 24 games. For the regular season Butch had 381 points. He added 48 points to this total in two games of the county tournament and then compiled totals of 107 points and 82 points in the district and state f tournaments, respectively. His average for the entire season was 25.7 points.


