

Braves Win Double-Header 1-0, 7-1 Over Ferrum Nine

MURFRESBORO — Chowan Junior College ended the month and their conference season in fine fashion. Chowan swept a double header from Louisburg Junior College 1-0 and 7-1 at Louisburg on Saturday.

The Chowan Braves are now in second place in the Cavalier Tarheel Conference with a 3-5 conference record and 7-8 overall record.

In the first game Eric Harris shut out Louisburg by pitching a five hitter. Eric's record now is 2-2. Harris struck out eight and walked three.

Louisburg's pitcher Pete Eyer gave up two hits, struck out five and walked none. Louisburg made two errors. Chowan scored their only run in the top of the seventh. Dickie Turner started off the inning with an infield out. Joe Willis got on by a throwing error by the third baseman, Wayne Vick.

Willis moved to second on a stolen base. Willis moved to third on a single by Ronnie Hendricks. Then Hendricks moved to second on a stolen base.

Willis scored on a sacrifice fly to the center fielder by Alton Green. Tommy Brooks ended the inning by an infield out. Gary Hall, the left fielder, got the only other hit for Chowan when he got a single in the sixth inning.

off five hits and one walk. Louisburg's team made two errors.

Chowan scored four runs in the first inning with two outs. Gary Hall started the inning off with infield out, then Pete Bryant filed out to the second baseman. Dickie Turner started the barrage off with a single. Turner moved to second on a single by Joe Willis. Tommy Jobe was walked to load the bases. Then Alton Green hit a double to score Turner and Willis, leaving Jobe on third. Then Tommy Brooks came up and hit a double to score Jobe and Green. Brooks moved to third on a stolen base. Harold Newton was walked by the relief pitcher Winslow. Ronnie Hendricks ended the inning with an outfield fly.

In the second inning Gary Hall got on base by being hit and scored when Dickie Turner hit a double. Chowan scored its sixth run in the fifth inning when Tommy Brooks hit a 340 foot home run with no men on.

The Braves scored its last run in the seventh inning.

Alton Green got on with a hard hit triple into deep center field and scored when Tommy Brooks hit a sacrifice fly in left field.

Louisburg scored its only run in the bottom of the second inning. Wayne Vick got on by a walk. Bob Queen filed out to Gary Hall. Vick moved to second on a walk by Ronnie Johnson. Vick scored on a single by Chris Beck. Beck moved to second on the throw.

Larry Dean was walked to load the bases. Winslow struck out for the second out and Moore ended the inning with an infield out.

The Chowan Braves have three more games left on their schedule. The Braves go to Newport News Apprentice on Thursday. The Braves play their last home game against East Carolina Freshmen on Friday, May 6. Chowan ends the season with a away game with Old Dominion Freshmen on Monday, May 9.
