Pamlico, Coastal Plains' Top Team, Sets Eagles Back, 6-1

Pamlico, the Coastal Plains baseball leader handed Morehead City a 6-1 setback Tuesday afternoon at Pamlico. It was the second time this year the conference leaders beat the Eagles.

The Eagles are now at a .333 clip in the conference with three wins against a half dozen losses.

Morehead City scored their lone run in the first inning when Dan McQueen collected a single and Ed Sanderson blasted a triple to score McQueen.

Pamlico was also busy in the first inning as they took the lead 4-1 pushing across four runs off four hits in the first frame.

The hosting Coastal Plains team scored again in the bottom of the sixth when the Pamlico leftfielder boomed out a round-tripper with one man on base.

Mike Clapsadl started for the Eagles and gave up four runs off of four hits. Bernard Leary relieved him in the second inning and issued three walks and struck out three. The Pamlico batters got to Leary for four hits and two runs.

Morehead City will play their last baseball game of the season when they take on Wallace-Rose Hill today in a home game.
