

Morehead Takes Pair From Lejeune Tuesday

Morehead City's Eagles won over Lejeune at the Camp Lejeune court Tuesday night by a score of 79-56. The Eagles won the prelim 43-31.

The victory by the Eagles gives them a 14-1 record for the campaign, and leaves them deadlocked with Newport for the conference title.

Morehead moved out to a 15-12 lead at the end of the first period and extended their advantage to 36-31 at the half. At the end of three quarters they led 63-44 and were never headed.

Wayne Cheek led the scoring parade with 23 points with teammates Bradley McIntosh 21 and Llewellyn Phillips 10, also hitting for double figures.

Bob Salisbury was high point-maker for the Devilpups with 19 markers as Ed Donahou tallied 12.

The preliminary saw the Eagles lead 9-7 at the end of the initial stanza. Morehead's sextet trailed at halftime 16-19, but at the end of the third quarter they led once again 32-25 and they coasted in for the win.
