

League Denies Play-Off Berth To Havelock Semi-Pro Club

Pamlico Forfeits To New Bern Are Bone Of Contention

The Havelock Semi-Pro baseball team will not play in the Quad-County league play-offs, it was learned this week.

Albert Gianotti reported Tuesday that a league meeting Monday night in Cove City denied the local club the right to appear in the playoffs. There had been some dispute over three games which Pamlico had forfeited to New Bern, Mr. Gianotti said.

"When we raised the question concerning these games which were keeping us out of the play-offs, we couldn't get any satisfaction," he reported. The Havelock representatives walked out of the meeting.

Mr. Gianotti said that it was hoped that the old Tidewater League would be reorganized next year, and the local team would become a member of that league.

The Havelock team will play no more games this year.

Mr. Gianotti released the final statistics on the team's record this summer. Out of 26 games, the locals won 10 and lost 16 games. The team batting average was .336.

After two months at Okinawa and nine months at Guam—where he played with the Marine Air Group 24 team—Stewart returned to the states for a short stay at El Toro, Calif., and then came to Cherry Point.
