

Newport Loses 6-2 to Smyrna

Smyrna and Newport clashed Tuesday to leave Smyrna the winner 6-2 in a game at Newport. Heavy hitting by A. C. Davis with a triple in the third, and doubles in the fourth and sixth innings gave Smyrna the lead.

Also showing up well at the bat for Smyrna were Manley Lawrence with a triple and Barry Willis with a triple.

Pitching for Smyrna was Barry Willis and for Newport, Aycock, with Winberry relieving in the last inning.

Smyrna scored one run in the first, three in the fourth and two in the sixth for the score of 6. Runs for Newport came in the fourth and seventh. Smyrna got ten hits, with only the fifth going hitless. Newport had three blank innings, the second, third and sixth.
