Beaufort's Jayvees split a double-header with the visiting New Bern teams Thursday night, losing the feature game 46-26 and winning the prelim 23-18.

New Bern moved out to a 13-4 lead at the end of the first quarter of the feature contest and extended the advantage to 24-8 at halftime. At the end of three quarters they continued on their winning way with a 35-18 lead.

Jean Earl Worthington was high scorer for the winners with 13 points as Donald Lamb tallied 10 markers.

Larry Dudley and Frank Potter tied for high score honors for the Seadogs with 8 points each.

The prelim saw the Beaufort girls take a 7-4 lead at the end of the first quarter. At the halftime they extended the advantage to 12-7, and at the end of three quarters they held onto a 15-13 advantage.

Nancy Mason and Elizabeth Edwards tied for scoring honors with 8 points each.
