Tidewater to Hold Meeting To Discuss Playoffs, Disputes

Two Schedule Changes Made in League Play

Two changes were announced yesterday in the Tidewater League schedule for this weekend. C. R. Hassell, manager of the Beaufort team, reported that instead of playing a home-and-home series with Jacksonville this weekend, the teams will play both games in Beaufort.

Wade Bell, president of the Morehead City club, announced that Morehead City would follow a similar procedure in its scheduled twin bill with Harkers Island-Straits, with both games being played in Morehead City.

The lid is threatening to blow off some allegedly shady doings in the Tidewater League this week end when representatives of the league's eight teams will meet in the Morchead City town hall.8 p. m. tomorrow night. The official purpose of the meeting is to discuss arrangements for the Shauennessy playoffs which are scheduled to start next weekend.

The teams that will take part in the palyoffs are Morehead City. Swansboro, Marshallberg, and Beaufort, the four teams that will finish in the first division.

Scheduled to be present at the league pow-wow is D. H. Lashley, president of the local circuit, who will preside over the meeting and who will attempt to settle a number of disputes and protests.

One of first things on the agenda is the disposal of a number of games involving Havelock, which were never plaved because of the spolio quarantine at Cherry Point Marine Base. Some quarters believe they should be listed as unplayed games, inasmuch as the quarantine occurred because of "an act of God."

According to latest reports, however, Havelock, which is still affected by the polio quarantine, intends to play Swansboro this week end with its playing ranks greatly depleted, making a double victory for Swansboro almost a certainty. Furthermore, the two teams intend to play off a postponed game, which, if also won by Swansboro, would blace Swansboro in no less than a tie for first place.

If Morehead City dropped one of its games with Harkers Island-Straits over the weekend. Swansboro would clinch the flag since there are no further games to be played in the regular season.

Morehead may protest this action on the grounds that if Havelock can play this weekend, it could have played the other contests that were called because of the quarantine. This may be held as tantamount to "throwing" the three scheduled games and putting Swansboro back in the race, if not giving them the championship.

Another matter that may be brought up before the league is the supposed resignation of Grant Privette as head umpire several weeks back. Privette has continued to officiate at league games, although some team officials hold that he is incligible since his resignation was accepted by the league.
